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No More Money No More War

- The Pentagon spends \$1 trillion a year, including \$11 billion a month on the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan
- Tens of thousands of lives in Iraq, Afghanistan, and Pakistan have been destroyed
- Thousands of U.S. soldiers return home severely injured or scarred for life
- Terrorism has gotten worse since the wars began.

It is too costly — in human lives, in money, in national security — to passively wait for the government to end its wars.

In an act of nonviolent civil disobedience, signers to the War Tax Boycott are severing our most direct connection to war by refusing some or all of our federal income tax dollars. With amounts both great and small, thousands in the U.S. take this stand despite the risks.

Refusing to pay for these wars is our way of dramatically taking our money out of the war-making machine and putting it into programs for peace, organizations helping victims of war, institutions working to rebuild what the U.S. military has destroyed.
